This is a matter of fundamental law. Civil liberties tend to be different from human rights, which are universal rights to which all people are entitled, regardless of where they live. Think of civil liberties as the rights that the government is contractually obliged to protect, usually by a constitutional bill of rights. Human rights are implied by human status, whether or not the Government has agreed to protect them. Most governments have passed constitutional bills of rights that make some pretend to protect basic human rights, so that human rights and civil liberties intersect more often than they do not. When the word freedom is used in philosophy, it usually refers to what we now call human rights, not civil liberties, because they are seen as universal principles and are not subject to a certain national standard. The term civil rights is almost synonymous, but it often specifically refers to the rights sought by African Americans during the American civil rights movement. The English phrase civil freedom was coined in 1788 by James Wilson, a Pennsylvania politician who advocated the ratification of the U.S. Constitution. Wilson said: We have noticed that civil government is needed to improve society. We are now making a point that civil liberties is necessary to improve civil governance. Civil freedom is in itself a natural freedom, devoid of only this part, which, placed in government, brings more goodness and happiness to society than if it remained in the individual. It follows that civil liberty, while retiring part of natural freedom, preserves the freedom and generous exercise of all human abilities as far as it is compatible with public welfare. However, the concept of civil liberties goes much further and is likely to precede the concept of universal human rights. The English Magna Carta libertatum calls itself the Magna Carta libertatum, but we can trace the origins of civil liberties much further to the Sumerian poem urakagin around the 24th century BC Poem, which establishes the civil liberties of orphans and widows and creates checks and balances to prevent abuses of power by the government. In the modern U.S. context, the phrase civil liberties is generally reminiscent of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), a progressive advocacy and judicial organization that promoted the phrase as part of its efforts to protect Bill's authority U.S. rights. The American Libertarian Party also claims to be defending civil liberties, but it has deemphasized civil liberties advocacy over the past few decades in favor of more more forms of paleoconservatism. The rights of the State, not personal civil liberties, are now given priority. None of the major U.S. political parties has a particularly impressive track record on civil liberties, though Democrats have historically been stronger on most issues because of their demographic diversity and relative independence from religious rights. While the American conservative movement has a more consistent history with regard to the Second Amendment and a prominent field, conservative politicians generally do not use the phrase civil liberties when it comes to these issues. They tend to avoid talking about the Bill of Rights for fear of being labeled moderate or progressive. As has been largely true since the 18th century, civil liberties are generally not associated with conservative or traditionalist movements. Given that liberal or progressive movements have historically failed to prioritize civil liberties, the need for aggressive advocacy of civil liberties, independent of other political objectives, becomes clear.
